### Assignment Summary

Artist statements discuss who a person is as an artist and about the work they have produced. Artists are asked to create many artist statement throughout their careers and in the digital age are often asked to create artist statements in digital formats. This task will help you learn to create an artist statement in the form of a video. The statement should tell about you as an artist and about your portfolio work-including the connection in your portfolio. Below are a list of questions that should guide your thinking about the content for statement in relationship to your portfolio work. This is not a list of questions that you should go through and answer each one, instead pick a few that resinate with you to focus on.

#### Video

- Use Adobe Spark
- 1-1  $\frac{1}{2}$  minutes in length
- First slide should have your name
- Must include <u>images</u> and <u>you speaking</u> about your work
- Words and music are optional
- Post a link to your video on Weebly
- Focus is on work from this semester

# Considerations

- Take time to plan out your statement before you start
- Consider writing out what you will say
- You need organization and flow to your piece- beginning, middle, end
- You can use first person pronouns like "I"
- It should sound conversational- imagine you are talking to someone about your work
- Needs to sound and look professional
- Leave time for revision
- Ask if you need help!
